

THE OHIO ADULT PAROLE BOARD

The parole system was designed as a way for incarcerated individuals to earn an early release through good behavior. Therefore, the job of the parole board should only be to determine whether or not an individual has displayed good behavior during their incarceration.

The Ohio Parole Board believes that no rules apply to them. They believe that they are more intelligent than the politicians and judges that the people of Ohio chose to elect. In some ways they must be correct, because as an appointed body, they have managed to become autonomous. They do not have to answer for their decisions to anyone. Not even to those that appointed them. Officials that are elected by the people are not given that kind of power. Even the President deals with checks and balances.

Part to the job of those elected to Political Office is to determine the appropriate sentence for criminal acts. The job of the judges elected to the bench is to determine what sentence to hand down to those convicted in their court. Those politicians and judges are elected because the people believe that they can be trusted to do the job they are being given. The Ohio Adult Parole Authority has no respect for the decisions made by the Citizens of Ohio.

The Ohio Parole Board is an appointed entity that has obviously determined that the elected officials are not competent enough to do their jobs and that the people of Ohio did not know what they were doing when they elected them. Therefore, they feel free to overrule any decisions these officials make. Why shouldn't they, since they don't have to answer to anybody for their own decisions?

I am attaching paperwork regarding my own personal experience with the Ohio Parole Board. This paperwork should clearly illustrate the following:

1. They not only feel that they can treat inmates any way they want to, they feel that they can treat ordinary citizens any way they want to as well. (My wife has never had so much as a traffic ticket, but they lied to her and used her in a way that had a devastating effect on her. (See next page).
2. Their letter in response to my "Request for reconsideration" shows that they do not deny anything I say in my paperwork and they obviously feel that they did absolutely nothing wrong.
3. The letter from the Governor's Office, in response to the same request for reconsideration, plainly shows that even he does not have the authority to reign them in.

In 2003 I appeared before the parole board, for the first time, having served well over 21 years in prison. I made the statement, "I want to go home so bad I can taste it, but if a condition of my release is

that I come before you and confess to a crime that I did not commit, then I will die behind these walls." The Ohio Parole Board will not even consider the possibility of innocence so they continued me for 10 more years.

I was scheduled to go before the parole board again in July of 2013. (Having served well over 31 years in prison. Almost exactly twice as long as I was alive prior to my incarceration).

In June of 2013 my wife met with a member of the parole board (Trayce Thalhiemer). She was told that I had always denied committing the crime, but if I would come before them and take responsibility for the crime then things would go much better for me than they had the first time I saw them. She made it plain to my wife that it was my only chance to come home.

Since they control your life, a confession to the parole board is one made under duress. The same as if someone made you confess at gunpoint. It means nothing but my wife knew I was still determined never to do it.

After her meeting my wife came to me and begged me to tell them whatever they wanted to hear so that I could come home to her. With great reluctance, I finally agreed.

I went before the parole board and took responsibility for a crime I had nothing to do with, and at the end of that hearing they continued me for another 10 years. My wife was, and still is, devastated by their act. She feels as though she was duped into betraying me. The Parole Board used her as a tool against me.

I understand that to ask for a reconsideration of a Parole Board decision I need to list some facts that the Parole Board did not have during the initial hearing. I intend to list those facts at the end of this request. First I would like to outline some facts that I feel are pertinent to this situation.

When I was seen by the Parole board, on July 18, 2013, I had a wife, a support system in place, a home in a decent area of Dayton, and a job offer from a man who is a respected member of his community and has worked for the city of Dayton for more than 25 years. (See attached letters). On top of that The board acknowledged that I had a good institutional record and that my conduct had improved. Despite all of this, they still continued me for 10 years.

By their actions the Parole Board is clearly indicating one of two things. 1). That no matter what I do, they have already determined to let me die in prison. Or 2). They only intend to release me from prison when I have lost everything and they are certain that I have no chance of being a productive member of society.

It has to be one of those two things because no rational person could possibly say that the 47 year old man who appeared before the Parole Board is the same person as the boy who was 15 years old when this crime was committed.

Now I would like to review the reasons that the Parole Board gave for the 10 year continuance. (Which, by the way, is the second consecutive 10 year continuance I have received).

1). "Lack of risk relevant programs"--(Anger Management, Recovery Services, and a Comprehensive sex offender program were listed).

They stated that I was high the night this crime took place and that I was angry with the victim. What they did not say was that I was 15 years old at the time and that was more than 31 years ago.

In more than 31 years I have had one fight (More than 25 years ago) and if you check the R.I.B. disposition you will see that the other inmate admitted to attacking me and all I did was defend myself. No one was hurt.

Not once during my incarceration have I failed a drug test or been involved with drugs or alcohol, in any way.

When I inquired about taking the Comprehensive sex offender program (At the Madison Correctional Institution) I was informed that the program had been discontinued. That was not my fault and, of my own free will, I sought out inmates who had taken the program to discuss what they had learned from it.

The Department of Rehabilitation and Corrections has monitored me 24 hours a day 7 days per week for more than 30 years and yet the D.R.&C. does not feel that I need these programs, As indicated by the attached Reentry Accountability Plan. Anger Management and Recovery Services do not even appear on the list of recommended programs. The Comprehensive sex offender program was recommended but not required. This is made clear by the fact that the Comprehensive sex offender program falls under the Personal/Emotional orientation section and if you look under that section you will see that it says "No need for improvement". If the professionals who have interacted with me for more than 30 years feel that I have "No need for improvement" in these important areas then how can a Parole Board member who has never met me have one brief meeting with me and say, in essence, that these other professionals within the D.R.&C. have no idea of what they are doing?

2). "Nature of the offense"- We all know that the nature of the offense will never change. The only thing that can change is the person and when the Parole Board chooses to ignore that change they use "Nature of the offense" as a reason because they have no legitimate reason.

3). "Questionable release plan"- I have already stated what I had waiting for me upon my release. Any reasonable person knows that you cannot ask for a better release plan than one that includes a wife, a support system, a decent home, and a job.

Ms. Thalheimer later told my wife that it was because she and I were married during my incarceration and she felt I would be better off with someone I had known prior to my incarceration, or in a halfway house. There are two glaring flaws with that logic:

A). If they wanted me to go somewhere else then they could have made that a stipulation for parole.

B). Following that logic, the Parole Board only wants inmates to associate with the same people they were associating with when they got into trouble in the first place. This seems like a recipe for disaster. You would think that the Parole Board would want to see change.

I would also like to note that during my Parole hearing Ms. Thalheimer asked a couple of questions that I feel were totally inappropriate.

1). She asked if I thought my wife would leave me if I was given more time.

That question has nothing to do with me, or the crime. Instead it calls into question my wife's loyalty and commitment.

2). She asked if I thought my wife was still having a sexual relationship with her ex husband.

That has no relevance to the hearing. She is calling into question the integrity of two people who have never been involved in any type of criminal activity. (They are both law abiding citizens whose tax dollars help to pay her salary).

Now I will touch upon a few things that the Parole Board was not able to consider at my hearing.

1). Approx. 16 days after my Parole Hearing my Reentry Accountability Plan was reevaluated and, once again, the professionals that know me best saw "No need for improvement" in all areas listed. (See attached Reentry Accountability Plans).

2). When the Parole Board continued me for 10 years they called and had me sent to Mental Health Services (Where I was seen by Dr. Armstrong) to evaluate my mental state. Dr. Armstrong is a professional that the D.R.&C. trusts to evaluate inmates and determine their mental health needs. The Parole Board obviously recognizes those credentials since they had me sent there for evaluation.

Attached you will find a copy of a kite signed by Dr. Armstrong which clearly shows that I have no need for Anger Management nor do I have any need of Recovery services. (See attached Kite).

3). A Mr. Lindsey Dudas (Another member of the Ohio Adult Parole Authority) told my wife that I had ample opportunity, over the years, to take these programs on my own initiative.

I did not pursue these programs because I did not feel that I needed them and the D.R.&C. agreed with me. If these programs were a legitimate concern of the Parole Board then why is it that they were never mentioned at my Parole hearing in 2003?

I have been incarcerated since my 16th. birthday, so when I was told that I did not need any more programs I felt the best course of action, for me, would be to concentrate on educating myself in areas that would provide employable skills so that I could find a job and be a productive member of society when I am released from prison. (Over the years I have studied Hotel and Restaurant management, Auto Parts management, Business management, and Dental Lab Technology. I have a Paralegal degree with a specialized degree in Civil Litigation, I have a degree in Electrician's training, and I am currently most of the way through another Paralegal course. All of my degrees have been paid for by me or my loved ones. I have also held several jobs which taught me a variety of skills and for which I received some letters of recognition for the work ethics I displayed.

I chose to pursue things that would make me a more productive member of society rather than pursuing programs that noone felt I needed, except for people who do not know me. Can you honestly say that I chose the wrong course of action? (See attached documents pertaining to education and employment).

3). Approx. 16 days after my Parole hearing, after I had been continued for another 10 years, the professionals who know me best recommended that I be lowered from a medium security to a minimum security.

4). I believe this to be the most important issue of all:

In June, 2013 my wife and Mr. Donald Blocker met with Ms. Thalheimer, in Dayton, Ohio concerning my upcoming Parole hearing.

Both of these individuals state that during their interview with Ms. Thalheimer she stated that I had always denied committing the crime. She said that if I admitted to the crime before the Parole Board and answered their questions then this hearing would go far different and easier than my previous hearing.

After being told this, my wife came to me and asked me to do what they wanted so that I could come home to her. I went before the Parole Board, said I had committed the crime, and answered all of their questions. The end result was the exact same as it had been at my previous hearing. I was continued for 10 more years.

When my wife heard this she was devastated by guilt. She felt as if she had been duped into betraying me. Since that moment she has been experiencing frequent and severe panic attacks, she is having trouble sleeping, she feels extreme guilt, and she finds it hard to focus. (If you believe that I am exaggerating these things then I will ask her lawyer to send you a copy of the report from her doctor verifying all of these things as well as stating the fact that he had to prescribe medication to help her deal with these issues).

My wife told an employee of the Parole Board that she intended to pursue legal remedies for what was done to her. Shortly after that she received a phone call from Ms. Thalheimer trying to convince her that she had not been lied to, even though there was a witness in the room who had also heard the lie. On another day she received a call from Mr. Dudas for basically the same purpose.

My wife then attempted to speak to the D.R.&C. director (Mr. Mohr). When she was told that he would not speak to her she stated that if it was necessary she would sit outside of his office until she spoke to Mr. Mohr. Since that moment she has faced harrasment. (Taxpayers dollars were wasted because the State Highway Patrol was sent to her home. Even though the original Incident Report clearly states that she only said she would sit outside of Mr. Mohr's office until she "Spoke" to him. There was no threat either direct or implied).

She also had a visiting restriction placed on her for no reason. It was removed immediately when it was addressed, but it caused other complications that were inconvenient for my wife and I and only served to increase her stress level.

The only thing she did was ask to speak to Mr. Mohr (A public official) and state that she intended to exercise her constitutional right to seek legal redress for the wrong done to her. She should not have to face retaliation for that.

I told my wife that I could not expect her to stay alone waiting for me for another 10 years and that I would understand if she wanted to leave me and move on with her life. She told me that she loves me and does not want to leave me. She also told me that she feels partially responsible for the 10 year continuance I received and so she feels as if she is somewhat obligated to stay with me.

The point is: When the Parole Board continued me for 10 years, in many ways they punished her more than they punished me.

As you consider the facts contained in this "Request for Reconsideration" I ask you to, please, also take into consideration that I have been incarcerated for almost exactly twice as long as I was alive prior to my incarceration, I have not been a disciplinary problem, and I have all of the tools for success at my fingertips right now. After considering all of the facts I hope you will conclude that I should not have received any continuance.

We discussed the fact that the Parole board had continued me for 10 years twice and I did not act out in any kind of aggressive way.

We also discussed the fact that in more than 30 years of incarceration, I have never failed a drug test and I have never been involved with drugs or alcohol even though both are almost always readily available in the prison system.

My question is this: After speaking to me and reviewing my file is there anything that, in your professional opinion, indicates that I have a problem with anger or substance abuse for which I need to be treated?

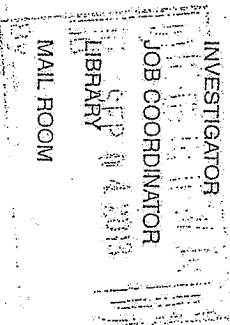

Dear Honorable Members of the Parole Board:

My name is Lori S. Wampler, I am the wife of inmate Charles K. Wampler A169-755. I have known Charles for 6 years. We got married October 27, 2008. I visit him once a week at London Correctional Institution. Since I have known Charles, he has stayed out of trouble, pursued education and worked to try to come home and help provide a home for us. We are writing to acknowledge receipt of your recent letter and information sent to Governor Kasich as well as the package sent to Attorney General Mike DeWine which was forwarded to our office. The Governor has asked me, as Assistant Chief Counsel, to respond.

Please be advised that, under Ohio law, matters of parole are under the authority of the Ohio Parole Board. The Governor does not have the authority to intervene in the decisions of the Parole Board. You may wish to contact the Ohio Parole Board at 770 West Broad Street, Columbus, Ohio 43222 for further assistance.

The Governor does, however, have the power of executive clemency, which includes the power to issue pardons, commutations and reprieves. In order to apply for clemency, you or your legal representative must obtain an application from the Ohio Parole Board by mailing a request directly to the Ohio Parole Board, 770 West Broad Street, Columbus, Ohio 43222, or by accessing an application at the Ohio Parole Board's website as follows:

Once the application is completed, it must be returned to the Ohio Parole Board for their review and recommendation. The Parole Board's report and recommendation are then forwarded to the Governor, who renders a decision. This process takes several months.
