No visible stains were apparent on the knife blade of Exhibit #1, however, preliminary chemical tests for blood traces were positive.

Exhibits #5a-#5g were examined with respect to blood and trace evidence resulting in the following findings:

No traces of blood were detected on any of these exhibits.

No significant foreign material was detected on any of these exhibits except for a trace piece of vegetation that was recovered from the right boot of Exhibit #5g. This piece of vegetation was compared to the vegetation specimens of Exhibits #2, #3 and #4. Due to the similarity of the specimens of Exhibits #2, #3 and #4, no statement can be made as to whether the vegetation

piece recovered from Exhibit #5g was more likely
to have come from one than the other.

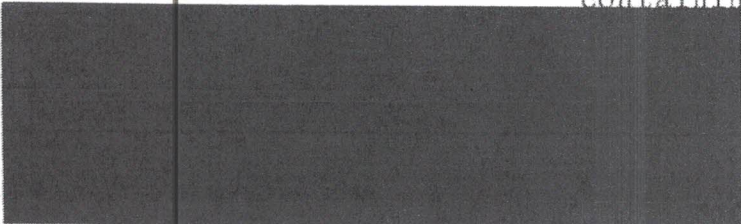





Exhibits #1-#13 were examined with respect to blood resulting in the following findings:

Red stains on the following items gave positive chemical and serological tests for human blood, type O:

- a) The yellow hand towel of Exhibit #1a
- b) The pink and white towel of Exhibit #1b1
- c) The paper sack of Exhibit #2
- d) The paper sack of Exhibit #3
- e) Red stains recovered from the end table in the living room at 2753 Cozy Lane (Exhibit 7i7)
- f) The toilet lid cover of Exhibit #9

Red stains on the following items gave positive chemical and serological tests for human blood, type A:

- a) The beer can of Exhibit #4
- b) The trousers of Exhibit #6e

Small stains on the gauze of Exhibit #6h, the sheet of Exhibit #6b1 and the curtain of Exhibit #10d gave positive chemical and serological tests for human blood. An insufficient quantity was present in these small stains for additional tests.

No visible stains were present on the knife of Exhibit #7b, but preliminary chemical tests indicate the presence of minute traces of blood. An insufficient quantity of material was present for additional tests.

The blood specimen of [REDACTED] is type O (Exhibit #11)

The blood specimen of Charles Keith Wampler is type A (Exhibit #12)

The blood specimens of Exhibit #9 (toilet lid cover), Exhibit #7i7 (end table stain) and Exhibit #11 (standard of [REDACTED]) were selected for additional blood grouping tests. These tests revealed the blood of Exhibits #9 and #11 to be type O, PGM 1, EAP B, ADA 1, and AK 1. Approximately 7.6% of the population would be expected to have this blood grouping combination. The only additional blood grouping that could be obtained from Exhibit #7i7 was PGM which was determined to be PGM 1.

Exhibits #1-#13 were examined with respect to semen resulting in the following findings:

No evidence of semen was detected on any of the victim's clothing (Exhibits #1d1, #1d2, #1d3, #1d4 and #1d5).

No trace of semen or significant foreign material was detected on the underwear or penile swabbing of Exhibits #5e and #5g.

No traces of semen was detected on the bed clothes of Exhibit #6a.

Stains located near the center of the sheet of Exhibit #6bl, gave positive chemical tests for semen.

Stains present on the white bath towel of Exhibit #6cl, gave positive chemical tests for semen.

Stains present on the tissue of Exhibit #6j gave positive chemical tests for semen.

Numerous stains present on the shirt of Exhibit #7a gave positive chemical tests for semen.

The seminal stains of Exhibits #6bl, #6j, and #7a each were subjected to serological tests resulting in the following findings:

The seminal stains of Exhibits #6bl and #7a originated from a type A secretor.

The seminal stain of Exhibit #6j originated from a non-secretor

The victim and the suspect were both determined to be non-secretors

The seminal stain of Exhibit #6cl was not suitable for blood grouping tests.

Exhibits #1-#13 were examined with respect to hair and trace evidence resulting in the following findings:

A green paint chip recovered from the towel of Exhibit #1bl was compared to the paint standards of 7i1 and 7i2 and determined to be dissimilar with respect to color, tint, texture and chemical solubility. These findings preclude identification as to a common source of origin.

Hair recovered from the towels of Exhibits #1b1 and #1b2 were compared to head hair standards of Charles Keith Wampler (Exhibit #5j) and Charles Cecil Wampler (Exhibit #7g) resulting in the following findings:

Two of the hairs recovered from the towel of Exhibit #1b2 and the hair of Exhibit #7g exhibit the same microscopic characteristics in all respects. These findings indicate the two hairs of Exhibit #1b2 could have come from Cecil Wampler.

Fiber tufts recovered from the heel of the right boot of Exhibit #1c and the shirt of Exhibit #1d3 were compared to the fibers in items recovered from 2753 Cozy Lane (Exhibits #6a-#6e) resulting in the following findings:

The fiber tufts recovered from #1c and #1d3 were examined chemically and microscopically and found to be composed of two different acrylic fibers and two different polyester fibers. The fabric in the blanket of Exhibit #6a4 contains the same four identical fibers. In addition, the surface dye used to produce the floral pattern on the top surface of the blanket was present on some of the fibers recovered from Exhibit #1c. These findings are consistent with the fibers of Exhibit #1c and #1d3 having come from the same source.

Numerous hairs were recovered from items identified as recovered from Charles Keith Wampler (Exhibits #5c and #5e and #5h). None of these hairs were found to be similar to the hair standards of the deceased.

Numerous hairs were recovered from items identified as recovered from 2753 Cozy Lane (Exhibit #6a1, #6a4, #6b2, #6b3, #6e, #7a, #7c and #7i3). None of these hairs were found to be similar to the hair standards of the deceased.


Hairs and fibers from Exhibits #6i, #7e and #7f were not evaluated.

The fabric in the toilet lid cover of Exhibit #9 was compared to the fabric in the two pieces of the toilet cover set in Exhibit 10b resulting in the following findings:


Exhibits #9 and #10b are composed of identical fibers. These findings are consistent with the pieces of Exhibits #9 and #10b having come from a matched set.


The blood and saliva of Exhibits #1 and #2 were determined to be from a type O secretor with the enzyme subgrouping ESD: 1, PGM: 2:1, Glo: 2, EAP: CA, ADA: 1, AK:1.

The hair specimens of Exhibits #3 and #4 were compared to the question hairs recovered from all previously submitted evidence resulting in the following findings:

The head and pubic hair specimen of Exhibits #3 and #4 are microscopically dissimilar to all question hairs recovered from the victim's body, clothes and the residence of Charles Keith Wampler.

The hair of Exhibit #lc was examined microscopically and determined to be a human head hair. This hair was compared to the head hair standards of [REDACTED] Charles Keith Wampler and Charles Cecil Wampler resulting in the following findings:

The hair of Exhibit #lc is foreign to the head hair standards of [REDACTED] and Charles Cecil Wampler.

Similarities and differences were noted between the hair of Exhibit #lc and the head hair standard of Charles Keith Wampler. Thus, no conclusion can be drawn as to the likelihood of these samples having come from the same source. An additional head hair sample from Charles Keith Wampler may permit a more definitive comparison.

No significant foreign material was detected in the nail scrapings of Exhibits #le and #lf.

Exhibit #li contains two hairs which were examined microscopically and determined to be human head hairs. These two hairs were compared to the head hair standards of [REDACTED] Charles Keith Wampler and Charles Cecil Wampler resulting in the following findings:

One of the hairs was determined to be microscopically similar to the head hair standard of [REDACTED]


The other hair and the head hair standard of Charles Keith Wampler were found to exhibit the same microscopic characteristics in all respects. These findings are consistent with the hair having come from Charles Keith Wampler.

It should be noted that hairs do not contain a sufficient number of individual characteristics to be identified as coming from one person to the exclusion of all others.






