On February 6, 1982, at approximately 3:50 p.m., Moraine Police Officer Brun was dispatched to an open field north of Kreitzer Road and west of the Gem City Estates, Inc., trailer park, 270 Dryden Road, Moraine, Ohio on report of a dead body.

Upon arrival, Officer Brun found the deceased body of a subject later identified as The body of the recently deceased victim

northwest corner of the mobile home residence of Charles Keith Wampler, a white male, 16 was found 177 feet from the years of age, and tracks on the snow-covered ground led from the location of the victim's body to the cement patio on the west side of the suspect's mobile-home residence. Along the tracks in the snow approximately equal distance from the location of the body and the suspect's mobile-home residence were found two recently discarded empty cans of Old 'lwaukee light beer.

e suspect's residence has a door opening on to the cement patio. The door is the nearest ccess point to the body in relation to the other mobile homes positioned adjacent to the acent field in which the victim's body was found. vacant field in which the victim's body was found.
The investigation of the scene of the location of the body revealed that the homicide had

taken place at another separate location and that the victim's body was then deposited in the

Located near and about the victim's body were various articles of the victim's clothing,

wwn milk products advertisement, and various grocery bags, printed with Stumps, Imperial redentification card, a book of matches printed with a Golden oodtown, and Super Rite advertisements. lso found at the location of the body were two blood-stained towels; one white and the other ellow in color. Turing an interview with the suspect's father, Charles C. Wampler, on February 7, 1982 at 2:11 a.m., the suspect's father was informed of his son's rights, which he voluntary waived. harles C. Wampler also consented to a search of his residence where his son resides, located dt 2753 Cozy Lane, in Moraine, Ohio. Turing the interview, Charles C. Wampler was shown the towels found at the location of the body; at which time, Charles C. Wampler positively identified the yellow towel as being from 2. Charles C. Wampler further stated that he discovered a blood stain on the exterior face of the entrance door to his residence at approximately noon (12:00 p.m.) on February 6, 1982. 3. Charles C. Wampler further stated that he purchased groceries at all of the stores who used the grocery bags found at the location of the victim's body. Based upon the above facts and beliefs, complainant REQUESTS that a warrant issue to proper police authority authorizing a personal search of the person(s) above described for the items and things named, and for a search of the described places and things for said items of property; and, if said items of property, or any part thereof, are found either in the places or in the things described or upon the person(s) described, authority is requested to seize said items of property which may be found and to seize the described person(s) in unlawful possession of or in unlawful control of said items of property. 5. The number of times affiant has previously and successfully relied upon the informant's information in the prosecution of criminal offenses.

c. Facts and circumstances obtained from reliable, disinterested citizens, naming them and indicating why such information is trustworthy, and that such information was within the personal knowledge of the citizen-informant.
